JUNIORS MATCH DAY AND TRAINING DAY

On weekend match day please ensure players arrive at the ground 30 minutes prior to kick-off. If you are running late please phone your coach. Players are to bring shinpads, drink, Montrose shorts and socks. Playing top will be supplied at the game.

Generally, all junior teams train every Thursday evening from 5pm onwards. As the club grows junior training will be held on other days as well.

JUNIOR GALA DAYS

UNDER 6 AND UNDER 7

Since 2008 Montrose, Boronia, Croydon, Mooroolbark and Ringwood Junior Soccer Clubs have run Gala Days within the Eastern region during the SSF season on a Saturday morning once a month during the season.

Under 6 and 7 SSF participants will experience of club versus club football within the Small-Sided Football formats. Each team may consist of as many players as the team wishes with a maximum of 4 on the field at any one time. There is no limit to the number of interchanges.

WHAT IS THE GALA DAY FORMAT?

Teams will be organised into 2 experience levels - Joesys for the less experienced and Kangaroos for the more experienced. Each team will then play 2 games within their age group, each of 2 x 15 minute halves with the first round commencing at approximately 10:15 am. Multiple games for each experience level will be held concurrently. The Gala Day conclude by 12:00 pm.

JUNIOR SMALL SIDED FOOTBALL

UNDER 8/9, UNDER 10, UNDER 11

Small Sided Football is a modified form of 11-a-side football, designed to meet the needs of players between the under 6 and 11 age groups, who have very different developmental characteristics and needs to adult players. The philosophy of Small Sided Football focuses on enjoyment and freedom of expression with limited emphasis on coaching per se, particularly in the formative years of a player's development.

The football games designed especially for children, with fewer players competing on a smaller-sized field. Players have more contact with the ball because fewer players are playing in a smaller playing area. Small Sided Football meets the developmental needs of younger football players whilst maintaining a strong focus on maximum participation and enjoyment.

Under 10 and Under 11 play 9 vs 9 on a half size pitch. Under 9 play 7 vs 7 on a quarter size pitch

OLDER JUNIOR TEAMS

UNDER 12 AND ABOVE

After graduating from Small Sided Football, players compete in 11-a-side football on full size pitches with official FFV Referees. Players will develop the skills taught and enjoy more time-on-the-ball and space that a full size pitch offers.
